is hereby issued a permit to use the waters from NORTH POWDER RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF POWDER RIVER for PRIMARY IRRIGATION OF 15.0 ACRES & SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 55.0 ACRES. The permit to the use of these waters has been issued under Application 69412 with a date of priority of OCTOBER 16, 1987. The permit is limited to not more than 1.75 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NW 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 5, T 7 S, R 38 E, WM; 2760 FEET SOUTH & 2380 FEET WEST FROM E1/4 CORNER, SECTION 32.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The permit shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior permit for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein.

The use of water allowed under this permit shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.
