are hereby issued a permit to use the waters from NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF UMPQUA RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 13.47 ACRES. The permit to the use of these waters has been issued under Application 69647 with a date of priority of JUNE 22, 1988 FOR 0.075 CFS AND OCTOBER 27, 1983 FOR 0.093 CFS. The permit is limited to not more than 0.168 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NW 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 18, T 26 S, R 3 W, WM; 660 FEET SOUTH & 2060 FEET WEST FROM E 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 18.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use of water allowed under this permit shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.


