are hereby issued a permit to use stored water only from Applegate Lake Reservoir constructed under Application R-57600, Permit R-7810, a tributary of Applegate River, for irrigation of 4.5 acres.

This permit to the use of these waters has been issued under Application 69548 with a date of priority of March 8, 1988. This permit is limited to not more than 10.0 acre feet of stored water each year, measured at the point of diversion on an unnamed slough.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

Applegate Lake Reservoir dam: within S1/2 SE 1/4, of Section 25, T 38 S, R 4 W, W.M.;

Unnamed Slough: within NW1/4 NE1/4 of Section 7, T 38 S, R 4 W, W.M. 560 feet South and 462 feet East from the N1/4 corner of Section 7.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4 1/2 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use of water allowed under this permit shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer and shall be subject to the terms and conditions of Contract No. 9-07-10-W0729 between the Bureau of Reclamation and the permittee, or a satisfactory replacement, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Director.

This development was reviewed and considered by the Water Resources Commission on December 9, 1988.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 2, 1990, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1991. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1992.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water. By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan. It is possible that the land use you propose may not be allowed if it is not in keeping with the goals and the acknowledged plan. Your city or county planning agency can advise you about the land-use plan in your area.
