### PERMIT to APPROPRIATE the PUBLIC WATERS

is hereby issued a permit to use the waters from DREWS CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF GOOSE LAKE, for IRRIGATION OF 81.8 ACRES. The permit to the use of these waters has been issued under Application 69543 with a date of priority of MARCH 3, 1988. The permit is limited to not more than 2.05 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

SE 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 18, T 40 S, R 19 E, WM;  
264 FEET NORTH & 2442 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 18.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use of water allowed under this permit shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The place of use is as follows:

Total: 81.8 acres.

The use of water under the permit is subject to the terms and conditions of the stipulation between Lakeview Water Users, Inc., and Kay C. Clark, recorded at Page 2177, Volume 7, Miscellaneous Records of the Water Resources Director, and by reference made a part of this permit.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 12, 1990, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1991. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1992.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water. By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.
