is hereby issued a permit to use the waters from A SPRING AND AN UNNAMED STREAM, TRIBUTARIES OF SLIDE CREEK, AND SLIDE CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF NORTH MYRTLE CREEK, AND AN UNNAMED RESERVOIR TO BE CONSTRUCTED UNDER APPLICATION R-69857, PERMIT R-11106, for IRRIGATION OF 24.0 ACRES AND DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE FAMILY INCLUDING IRRIGATION OF NOT TO EXCEED ONE-HALF ACRE LAWN AND NONCOMMERCIAL GARDEN.

The permit to the use of these waters has been issued under Application 69858 with a date of priority of MARCH 27, 1989 for 0.3 cfs from Slide Creek and reservoir for irrigation and 0.005 cfs from stream and spring and MAY 30, 1989 for 0.005 cfs from stream and spring for domestic supplies. The permit is limited to not more than 0.31 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, being 0.30 CFS FROM SLIDE CREEK WITH ANY DEFICIENCY IN THE AVAILABLE SUPPLY TO BE MADE UP BY DIVERSION FROM THE RESERVOIR FOR IRRIGATION; AND USE OF 0.01 CFS, being 0.001 CFS FROM SPRING AND 0.009 CFS FROM STREAM FOR DOMESTIC SUPPLIES, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 34, T 28 S, R 4 W, WM; reservoir 650 FEET SCUTH & 380 FEET WEST FROM E1/4 CORNER, SECTION 34.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated curing the irrigation season of each year.

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It is further provided that the right allowed herein shall be limited during the period July 15 through September 30 of each year to human consumption, livestock consumption for such animals as are essential to the proper sustenance of the family and irrigation of a noncommercial garden not to exceed one-half acre in area.

The use of water allowed under this permit shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The place of use is as follows:

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 23, 1990, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1991. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1992.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water. By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan. It is possible that the land use you propose may not be allowed if it is not in keeping with the goals and the acknowledged plan. Your city or county planning agency can advise you about the land-use plan in your area.

The right is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.
