to use the waters of SCOGGINS RESERVOIR, constructed under Permit R-5777, a tributary of TUALATIN RIVER, for the purpose of WATER QUALITY CONTROL.

This Permit is issued approving Application 69997. The date of priority is JULY 10, 1989. The use is limited to not more than 6300 ACRE-FEET in addition to the 10,600 af under Permit 35792, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 20, T 1 S, R 4 W, W.M.; 700 FEET SOUTH AND 1030 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER, SECTION 20.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

This project was considered and approved by the Water Resources Commission on January 5, 1990.

A description of the proposed place of use under the Permit is as follows:

TUALATIN RIVER PAST LAKE OSWEGO CANAL DIVERSION

SECTIONS 19, 20, 21, 28, 33 & 34
TOWNSHIP 2 SOUTH, RANGE 1 EAST, W.M.

SECTIONS 2 & 3
TOWNSHIP 3 SOUTH, RANGE 1 EAST, W.M.

SECTIONS 13 THROUGH 21 & SECTION 24
TOWNSHIP 2 SOUTH, RANGE 1 WEST, W.M.

SECTIONS 28, 29 & 32
TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.

SECTIONS 4, 5, 9, 10, 11, 13 & 14
TOWNSHIP 2 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before JANUARY 17, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1991. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1992.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use granted herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
