THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of COW CREEK AND GALESVILLE RESERVOIR, constructed under Permit R-9964, tributaries of SOUTH UMPQUA RIVER, for QUASI-MUNICIPAL USE by the South Umpqua River Association.

This Permit is issued approving Application 69164. The date of priority is JUNE 29, 1987. The use is limited to not more than 0.67 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND AND 10.0 ACRE-FEET STORED WATER ONLY, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion from the sources.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

GALESVILLE RESERVOIR SW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 28, T 31 S, R 4 W, W.M.; 2920 FEET NORTH AND 2060 FEET WEST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 28.

RIDDLE DIVERSION SE 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 24, T 30 S, R 6 W, W.M.; 2140 FEET SOUTH AND 2240 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER, SECTION 24.

Water shall not be appropriated from direct flow during the period from July 15 to September 30 of each year, except for human and livestock consumption.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under the Permit is as follows:

SECTIONS 15 THROUGH 22, AND 27 THROUGH 34
TOWNSHIP 30 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST, W.M.

SECTIONS 1 THROUGH 6
TOWNSHIP 31 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST, W.M.

SECTIONS 13, 14, AND 22 THROUGH 36
TOWNSHIP 30 SOUTH, RANGE 6 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before FEBRUARY 9, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1991. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1992. B+C to 10-1-94

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use granted herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
