to use the waters of UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of PACIFIC OCEAN, for IRRIGATION OF 150.0 ACRES.

This Permit is issued approving Application 69999. The date of priority is JULY 17, 1989. The use is limited to not more than 1.88 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

SE 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 23, T 25 S, R 7 W, W.M.; 3020 FEET NORTH AND 1370 FEET EAST FROM W 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 26.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under the Permit is as follows:

SW 1/4 SW 1/4	18.3 ACRES

SE 1/4 SE 1/4	25.4 ACRES

SECTION 26

TOWNSHIP 25 SOUTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife specifications.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before MARCH 9, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1991. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1992.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.
