PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of GALESVILLE RESERVOIR, constructed under Permit R-9964, a tributary of SOUTH UMPQUA RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 1.4 ACRES AND GENERAL PARK USE.

This Permit is issued approving Application 70138. The date of priority is DECEMBER 8, 1989. The use is limited to not more than 0.06 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, being 0.04 CFS for irrigation and 0.02 CFS for park use, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

GALESVILLE RESERVOIR SW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 28, T 31 S, R 4 W, W.M.; 2920 FEET NORTH AND 2060 FEET WEST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 28.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under the Permit is as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4 0.8 ACRE & PARK USE
SE 1/4 NW 1/4 0.6 ACRE & PARK USE
SECTION 27
TOWNSHIP 31 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before MARCH 9, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1991. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1992.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use granted herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
