to use the waters of WINCHESTER CREEK, a tributary of SOUTH SLOUGH for SUPPLEMENTAL INDUSTRIAL USE.

This Permit is issued approving Application 69109. The date of priority is MAY 26, 1987. The use is limited to not more than 7.0 GALLONS PER MINUTE, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 14, T 27 S, R 14 W, W.M.; 10 FEET SOUTH AND 230 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER, SECTION 14.

This supplemental source may be used only when the primary source is unavailable either due to lack of water, equipment malfunction that restricts access to the primary source or any problem beyond the control of the County that actually limits full access to the primary source. In the event the County must resort to the supplemental source, such use shall be for no longer than absolutely necessary and shall not exceed the 7.0 GPM limitation of the primary source. In the event both sources are used simultaneously, the total diverted from both sources shall not exceed the 7.0 GPM limitation of the primary source.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

NW 1/4 NW 1/4 SECTION 25 TOWNSHIP 27 SOUTH, RANGE 14 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before MARCH 12, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1991. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1992. B Extended to October 1, 1992.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
