## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of McKENZIE RIVER, a tributary of WILLAMETTE RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 0.65 ACRE.

This Permit is issued approving Application 70219. The date of priority is MARCH 5, 1990. The use is limited to not more than 0.01 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 27, T 17 S, R 2 W, W.M.; 129 FEET SOUTH AND 528 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER, SECTION 27.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

SE 1/4 SE 1/4 0.43 ACRE SECTION 22

NE 1/4 NE 1/4 0.22 ACRE SECTION 27 TOWNSHIP 17 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed and operated to Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife specifications.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before JUNE 18, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties or cancellation of the permit.
