PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

to use the waters of JACK CREEK, a tributary of KLAMATH MARSH, for ROAD CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE.

This Permit is issued approving Application 66595. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 21, 1983. The use is limited to not more than 1.0 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND NOT TO EXCEED 8.0 ACRE-FEET PER YEAR, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

SE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 19; SE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 32, T 27 S, R 10 E, W.M.; NW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 23, NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 27, T 28 S, R 10 E, W.M.; 1100 FEET NORTH AND 800 FEET WEST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 19; 650 FEET NORTH AND 850 FEET WEST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 32; 1500 FEET NORTH AND 300 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 23; 1800 FEET NORTH AND 950 FEET WEST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 27.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under the Permit is as follows:

SECTION 13
TOWNSHIP 27 SOUTH, RANGE 9 EAST, W.M.

SECTIONS 18, 19, 20, 21, 25 THROUGH 36
TOWNSHIP 27 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST, W.M.

SECTIONS 1 THROUGH 6, 8, 9 THROUGH 16, 22 THROUGH 27, 34, 35 AND 36
TOWNSHIP 28 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST, W.M.

SECTIONS 1, 2 AND 3
TOWNSHIP 29 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before JUNE 25, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
