to use the waters of DEER CREEK, a tributary of KLAMATH MARSH, for ROAD CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE.

This Permit is issued approving Application 66594. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 21, 1983. The use is limited to not more than 1.0 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND NOT TO EXCEED 5.0 ACRE-FEET PER YEAR, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 24, T 27 S, R 7 E, W.M.; 250 FEET SOUTH AND 2250 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER, SECTION 24.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

SECTIONS 1, 3, 11, 13, 14, 15, 23 AND 24 TOWNSHIP 27 SOUTH, RANGE 7 EAST, W.M.

SECTIONS 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, 15, 17, 19, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31, 35 AND 36 TOWNSHIP 27 SOUTH, RANGE 8 EAST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before JUNE 25, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
