to use the waters of HUNT CREEK, a tributary of COLUMBIA RIVER, for QUASI-MUNICIPAL USES.

This Permit is issued approving Application 69806. The date of priority is JANUARY 17, 1989. The use is limited to not more than 1.0 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 29, T 8 N, R 6 W, W.M.; 200 FEET SOUTH AND 950 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER, SECTION 29.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife specifications.

The permittee shall not install, operate or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction in Hunt Creek.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under the Permit is as follows:

SECTIONS 5 THROUGH 9, 16 THROUGH 21 AND 28 THROUGH 30 TOWNSHIP 8 NORTH, RANGE 6 WEST, W.M.

ALL

TOWNSHIP 8 NORTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.

SECTION 31

TOWNSHIP 9 NORTH, RANGE 6 WEST, W.M.

SECTIONS 25 THROUGH 27 AND 33 THROUGH 36 TOWNSHIP 9 NORTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before AUGUST 20, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

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Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.
