to use the waters of WILLAMETTE RIVER, a tributary of COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 99.0 ACRES.

This Permit is issued approving Application 69741. The date of priority is OCTOBER 21, 1988. The use is limited to not more than 1.24 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 6, T 11 S, R 3 W, W.M.; 2700 FEET SOUTH AND 100 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 32.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

Actual construction work shall begin on or before AUGUST 29, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.
