to use the waters of DEER CREEK, a tributary of SOUTH UMPQUA RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 0.5 ACRE.

This Permit is issued approving Application 70380. The date of priority is MAY 25, 1990. The use is limited to not more than 0.005 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

Use of water is limited to irrigation of up to one-half acre noncommercial garden from July 15 through September 30 each year.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

SE 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 23, T 27 S, R 5 W, W.M.; 2020 FEET SOUTH AND 1660 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER, SECTION 23.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

SE 1/4 NW 1/4 0.5 ACRE SECTION 23 TOWNSHIP 27 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before SEPTEMBER 10, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.
