PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

to use the waters of UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of PACIFIC OCEAN, for IRRIGATION OF 55.8 ACRES.

This Permit is issued approving Application 70501. The date of priority is JULY 23, 1990. The use is limited to not more than 0.69 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

NW 1/4 SE 1/4, SE 1/4 SE 1/4, SW 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 20, T 22 S, R 8 W, W.M.; 2500 FEET NORTH AND 1570 FEET WEST; 530 FEET NORTH AND 570 FEET WEST, BOTH FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 20; 400 FEET NORTH AND 138.6 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER, DLC 45.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4	0.3 ACRE
SE 1/4 NE 1/4	1.8 ACRES
NE 1/4 SE 1/4	11.7 ACRES
NW 1/4 SE 1/4	15.0 ACRES
SW 1/4 SE 1/4	15.0 ACRES
SE 1/4 SE 1/4	12.0 ACRES
SECTION 20	
TOWNSHIP 22 SOUTH, RANGE 8 WEST, W.M.	

Actual construction work shall begin on or before SEPTEMBER 10, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993. *extended to 10-1-93, PIC 10-1-95*

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.
