PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

to use the waters of APPELGATE LAKE RESERVOIR, constructed under Permit R-7810, a tributary of APPELGATE RIVER, for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 20.0 ACRES.

This Permit is issued approving Application 69583. The date of priority is APRIL 6, 1988. The use is limited to not more than 40.0 ACRE-FEET ANNUALLY OF STORED WATER ONLY, measured at the point of diversion on the river.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

SE 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 30, T 38 S, R 3 W, W.M.; RIVER - 2510 FEET SOUTH AND 3370 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER, DLC 39; RESERVOIR - S 1/2 SE 1/4, SECTION 25, T 40 S, R 4 W, W.M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. This right shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

SE 1/4 SW 1/4 1.2 ACRES
SECTION 14

LOT 1 NE 1/4 NW 1/4 13.9 ACRES
NW 1/4 NW 1/4 4.9 ACRES
SECTION 23

TOWNSHIP 38 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.

The use of water under this permit is subject to the terms and conditions of Contract 8-07-10-W0717 between the Bureau of Reclamation and the applicant, or a satisfactory replacement, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Director.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before SEPTEMBER 17, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
