This Permit is issued approving Application 70019. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 11, 1990. The use is limited to not more than 0.1 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 26, T 8 S, R 42 E, W.M.; 126 FEET SOUTH AND 153 FEET WEST FROM N 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 26.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

This project was considered and approved by the Water Resources Commission on AUGUST 17, 1989.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before OCTOBER 1, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.
