PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of WILLAMETTE RIVER BY DIVERSION FROM ADJACENT GRAVEL PITS, a tributary of COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 32.0 ACRES.

This Permit is issued approving Application 70322. The date of priority is APRIL 26, 1990. The use is limited to not more than 0.4 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

SE 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 26, T 4 S, R 3 W, W.M.; 900 FEET SOUTH AND 2270 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER, LOT 13.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

USE OF WILLAMETTE RIVER WATER BY A DIVERSION FROM ADJACENT GRAVEL PITS IS LIMITED TO APPROPRIATION OF DIRECT FLOW OF THE WATERS OF WILLAMETTE RIVER. THE USE IS LIMITED TO APPROPRIATION ONLY TO THE EXTENT THAT IT DOES NOT INTERFERE WITH THE RIGHT TO USE OF GROUND WATER BY OTHERS.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

SE 1/4 SE 1/4 3.5 ACRES

NE 1/4 NE 1/4 10.7 ACRES

ALL AS PROJECTED WITHIN DLC 86
SECTION 35
TOWNSHIP 4 SOUTH, RANGE 3 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before OCTOBER 1, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
