to use the waters of UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of PACIFIC OCEAN, for IRRIGATION OF 4.17 ACRES AND DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE FAMILY.

This Permit is issued approving Application 70561. The date of priority is AUGUST 20, 1990. The use is limited to not more than 0.055 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, BEING 0.050 CFS FOR IRRIGATION AND 0.005 CFS FOR DOMESTIC USE, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NW 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 30, T 24 S, R 7 W, W.M.; 1110 FEET SOUTH AND 1820 FEET WEST FROM E 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 30.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4 1.86 ACRES & DOMESTIC  
NW 1/4 SE 1/4 2.31 ACRES  
SECTION 30  
TOWNSHIP 24 SOUTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before OCTOBER 1, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
