ABSTRACT MADE

APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Charley C Reeves (Name of Applicant) of Baker (Postoffice), County of Baker State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Powder River (Name of stream)

tributary of Snake River

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 1/40 (.025) cubic feet per second.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Irrigation (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.)

4. The point of diversion is located South 350 feet from the quarter corner between Secs. 20 & 21 Tp. 9 S R 40 E.W.M., being the approximate point of diversion of the Old Settlers Slough from Powder River; the water is then diverted from the slough into the Easterbrook ditch at a point on Myrtle Street.

being within the NE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Sec. 20, Tp. 9 S (Give smallest legal subdivision) (No. N. or S.)

R. 40 E, W. M., in the county of Baker (No. E. or W.)

5. The Slough 1/2 mile, Easterbrook 1/2 mile (Main ditch, canal or pipe line) to be miles in length, terminating in the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Sec. 20, Tp. 9 S (Smallest legal subdivision) (No. N. or S.)

R. 40 E, W. M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the accompanying map. (No. E. or W.)

6. The name of the ditch, canal or other works is (1) Old Settlers (2) Easterbrook Ditch.

DIVERSION WORKS—

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The right herein granted is limited to the appropriation of water from Powder River for irrigation purposes.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 0.025 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is June 17, 1921

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 5, 1922 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 1, 1923

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before

October 1, 1924
