PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of FANNO CREEK, a tributary of TUALATIN RIVER, to maintain JUNOR LAKE RESERVOIR to be constructed under Application R-70184, Permit R-11264, for RECREATION AND AESTHETICS.

This Permit is issued approving Application 70185. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 1, 1990. THE USE IS LIMITED TO THE PERIOD OCTOBER 1 THROUGH APRIL 30 OF EACH YEAR AND NOT MORE THAN 0.1 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NW 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 24, T 1 S, R 1 W, W.M.; 1148 FEET SOUTH AND 819 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER, SECTION 24.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under the Permit is as follows:

W 1/2 NW 1/4
SECTION 24
TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 1 WEST, W.M.

When in the judgment of the watermaster it becomes necessary to regulate waters of the stream system, use of water shall be subject to the installation of suitable devices for measuring flows diverted into the reservoir from Fanno Creek, incoming natural flows of Hunt Club Creek basin into the reservoir and outflows from the reservoir. The types and plans for such devices shall be approved by the watermaster and shall be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 17, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

"CERTIFICATE NO. 68631"

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
