PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

to use the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM AND A RESERVOIR CONSTRUCTED UNDER APPLICATION R-71146, PERMIT R-11363, a tributary of FRAZIER CREEK, for IRRIGATION OF 3.2 ACRES AND RECREATION.

This permit is issued approving Application 71147. The date of priority is JANUARY 23, 1991. The use is limited to not more than 0.06 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 0.04 CFS FOR IRRIGATION AND 0.02 CFS FOR RECREATION, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

SW 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 10, T 11 S, R 5 W, W.M.; 1200 FEET NORTH AND 940 FEET EAST, FROM S 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 10.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year from direct flow and storage.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this permit is as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4 0.4 ACRE
NW 1/4 SE 1/4 2.2 ACRES
SW 1/4 SE 1/4 0.4 ACRE AND RECREATION
SE 1/4 SE 1/4 0.2 ACRE AND RECREATION
SECTION 10
TOWNSHIP 11 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before MARCH 25, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
