to use the waters of UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of PACIFIC OCEAN, for IRRIGATION OF 48.6 ACRES.

This Permit is issued approving Application 70536. The date of priority is AUGUST 3, 1990. The use is limited to not more than 0.61 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 21; SW 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 22, T 22 S, R 8 W, W.M.; 2540 FEET SOUTH AND 495 FEET WEST; 1680 FEET SOUTH AND 660 FEET EAST, BOTH FROM NE CORNER, SECTION 21.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

NE 1/4 NE 1/4 1.2 ACRES SW 1/4 NE 1/4 8.7 ACRES SE 1/4 NE 1/4 29.6 ACRES SECTION 21

NW 1/4 NW 1/4 4.8 ACRES SW 1/4 NW 1/4 4.3 ACRES SECTION 22 TOWNSHIP 22 SOUTH, RANGE 8 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 25, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

PAGE TWO

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
