PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of APPELGATE RESERVOIR, CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-7810, a tributary of ROGUE RIVER, for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 11.7 ACRES.

This permit is issued approving Application 71313. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 20, 1991. The use is limited to not more than 17.55 ACRE FEET OF STORED WATER ONLY, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

APPELGATE RESERVOIR - SE 1/4, SECTION 25, T 40 S, R 4 W, W.M.;

KUBLI DITCH - SE 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 30, T 38 S, R 3 W, W.M.; 2510 FEET SOUTH AND 3370 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER, DLC 39.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of 4.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. This right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land.

The water user shall comply with the terms and conditions of contract # 1-07-10-W0843 dated 6th day of May 1991, between Bureau of Reclamation and Vaughn E. Jones. A copy of the contract is in Application File # 71313 at the Water Resources Department.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this permit is as follows:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4 1.0 ACRES
SECTION 22
NW 1/4 NW 1/4 2.8 ACRES
SW 1/4 NW 1/4 7.9 ACRES
SECTION 23
TOWNSHIP 38 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 1, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
