to use the waters of NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of UMPQUA RIVER, for DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE FAMILY INCLUDING IRRIGATION OF NOT TO EXCEED ONE-HALF ACRE LAWN AND NONCOMMERCIAL GARDEN.

This Permit is issued approving Application 70678. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 21, 1990. The use is limited to not more than 0.01 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 16, T 26 S, R 3 W, W.M.; 100 FEET SOUTH AND 1580 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER, SECTION 16.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4
SECTION 16
TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 3 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 15, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.
