PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of LITTLE RIVER, a tributary of NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 6.0 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL DOMESTIC USE EXPANDED FOR ONE FAMILY.

This permit is issued approving Application 71170. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 6, 1991. The use is limited to not more than 0.080 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, BEING 0.075 CFS FOR IRRIGATION AND 0.005 CFS FOR DOMESTIC or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. Water may only be appropriated for irrigation during the period March 1 through June 30.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 34, T 26 S, R 3 W, W.M.; 1460 FEET NORTH AND 1040 FEET WEST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 34.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this permit is as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4 1.8 ACRES
SE 1/4 SE 1/4 4.2 ACRES AND DOMESTIC
SECTION 34
TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 3 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 15, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
