to use the waters of UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of PACIFIC OCEAN, for IRRIGATION OF 10.0 ACRES.

This permit is issued approving Application 71483. The date of priority is APRIL 4, 1991. The use is limited to not more than 0.125 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

SE 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 31, T 22 S, R 7 W, W.M.; 3010 FEET NORTH AND 1540 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 31.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this permit is as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4	3.7 ACRES
SE 1/4 NW 1/4	2.0 ACRES
NE 1/4 SW 1/4	1.6 ACRES
NW 1/4 SE 1/4	2.7 ACRES

SECTION 31

TOWNSHIP 22 SOUTH, RANGE 7 W, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 7, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
