PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of LOST CREEK RESERVOIR, constructed under Permit R-8140, a tributary of ROGUE RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 0.13 ACRE.

This Permit is issued approving Application 70466. The date of priority is JULY 6, 1990. The use is limited to not more than 0.585 ACRE FOOT STORED WATER ONLY, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

RIVER - SE 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 36, T 33 S, R 1 W, W.M.; 2403 FEET SOUTH AND 1106 FEET WEST FROM N 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 36.
LOST CREEK RESERVOIR - NW 1/4, SECTION 26, T 33 S, R 1 E, W.M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year from storage.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

SE 1/4 NW 1/4 0.13 ACRE
SECTION 36
TOWNSHIP 33 SOUTH, RANGE 1 WEST, W.M.

The use of water under this permit is subject to the terms and conditions of Contract NO.1-07-10-W0852 between the Bureau of Reclamation and the applicant, or a satisfactory replacement, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Director.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 14, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
