PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of AN UNNAMED SPRING, a tributary of MAYS CANYON CREEK, for DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE FAMILY, STOCKWATER AND IRRIGATION OF 21.7 ACRES.

This permit is issued approving Application 71076. The date of priority is DECEMBER 31, 1990. The use is limited to not more than 0.065 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 0.01 CFS FOR DOMESTIC, 0.01 CFS FOR STOCKWATER AND 0.045 CFS FOR IRRIGATION, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

SW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 11, T 2 S, R 13 E, W.M.; 200 FEET NORTH AND 1150 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 11.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this permit is as follows:

SW 1/4 SW 1/4 12.0 ACRES - DOMESTIC
SECTION 11
NW 1/4 NW 1/4 7.0 ACRES - STOCKWATER
SECTION 14
TOWNSHIP 2 SOUTH, RANGE 13 EAST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 21, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
