PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of OLALLA CREEK AND BEN IRIVING RESERVOIR CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R- 7256, tributaries of LOOKING GLASS CREEK, for DOMESTIC USE EXPANDED FOR ONE FAMILY.

This Permit is issued approving Application 70222. The date of priority is MARCH 6, 1990. The use is limited to not more than 0.01 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. No water may be appropriated from Olalla Creek during the period June 1 to September 30 except for domestic and livestock watering for livestock necessary for the subsistence of the family and less than 5000 gallons per day.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 8, T 29 S, R 7 W, W.M.; 1370 FEET NORTH AND 190 FEET WEST FROM S 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 8.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The water user shall comply with the terms and conditions of contract dated August 31, 1989 between Douglas County and Darrell L. Hamilton, or a satisfactory replacement, a copy of which is in Application File #70222 at the Water Resources Department.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

NE 1/4 SW 1/4
SECTION 8
TOWNSHIP 29 SOUTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 25, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
