PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of A SPRING AND EAST FORK COQUILLE RIVER, tributaries of COQUILLE RIVER, for DOMESTIC USE EXPANDED FOR ONE FAMILY AND IRRIGATION OF 0.5 ACRE.

This permit is issued approving Application 70510. The date of priority is JULY 27, 1990. The use is limited to not more than 0.004 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 0.002 CFS EACH FROM EACH SOURCE, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4, SW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 10, T 28 S, R 11 W, W.M.;
SPRING - 854 FEET SOUTH AND 1485 FEET EAST; RIVER - 702 FEET SOUTH AND 203 FEET EAST, BOTH FROM NW CORNER, SW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 10.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this permit is as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4 0.5 ACRE AND DOMESTIC
SECTION 10
TOWNSHIP 28 SOUTH, RANGE 11 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 23, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

"CERTIFICATE NO. 72766

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
