to use the waters of FOUR UNNAMED STREAMS, a tributary of NORTH LOBSTER CREEK, for DOMESTIC USE EXPANDED FOR TWO FAMILIES, LIVESTOCK AND MAINTENANCE OF A RESERVOIR CONSTRUCTED UNDER APPLICATION R-71716, PERMIT R-11427 FOR RECREATION.

This permit is issued approving Application 71717. The date of priority is JUNE 24, 1991. The use is limited to not more than 0.03 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS) BEING 0.01 CFS FROM STREAM 1 FOR DOMESTIC AND LIVESTOCK WATER, 0.01 CFS FROM STREAM 2 FOR DOMESTIC, LIVESTOCK WATER AND USE IN BARN AND 0.01 CFS FROM TWO UNNAMED STREAMS FOR MAINTENANCE OF A RESERVOIR FOR RECREATION, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

NW 1/4 NE 1/4, SE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 1, T 15 S, R 4 W. W.M.; STREAM 1 - 182 FEET NORTH AND 603 FEET EAST, STREAM 2 - 1134 FEET NORTH AND 633 FEET EAST, BOTH FROM SE CORNER, SW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 1. STREAM 3 - 2430 FEET NORTH AND 710 FEET EAST, STREAM 4 - 2080 FEET NORTH AND 800 FEET EAST, BOTH FROM C 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 1.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this permit is as follows:

NW 1/4 NE 1/4 LIVESTOCK & MAINTENANCE OF RESERVOIR
SW 1/4 NE 1/4 DOMESTIC
SECTION 1
TOWNSHIP 15 SOUTH, RANGE 9 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 21, 1993, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
