PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of SANTOSH BARGE CHANNEL, a tributary of MULTNOMAH SLOUGH (WILLAMETTE RIVER), for INDUSTRIAL USE.

This permit is issued approving Application 69840. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 24, 1989. The use is limited to not more than 12.0 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

SE 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 29, NW 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 32, T 4 N, R 1 W, W.M.: 308 FEET NORTH AND 1233 FEET WEST; 100 FEET SOUTH AND 1682 FEET WEST; 647 FEET SOUTH AND 2146 FEET WEST; ALL FROM N 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 32.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

This permit is subject to the maintenance and use of adequate facilities for the treatment of the effluent meeting the requirements of the Department of Environmental Quality.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this permit is as follows:

N 1/2
SECTION 32
TOWNSHIP 4 NORTH, RANGE 1 WEST, W.M.

This development was reviewed and approved by the Water Resources Commission on December 20, 1991.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 2, 1993, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1994. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1995.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
