to use the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM AND ELK CREEK, a tributary of SOUTH UMPQUA RIVER, for DOMESTIC USE EXPANDED FOR ONE FAMILY.

This permit is issued approving Application 71951. The date of priority is OCTOBER 17, 1991. The use is limited to not more than 0.01 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND FROM UNNAMED STREAM WITH ANY DEFICIENCY TO BE MADE UP FROM ELK CREEK, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. It is further provided that the right allowed herein shall be limited during the period of July 1 through October 31 of each year to human consumption, livestock consumption for such animals as are essential to the proper sustenance of the family and irrigation of a noncommercial garden not to exceed 1/2 acre in area.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4, NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 33, T 30 S, R 2 W, W.M.; UNNAMED STREAM - 350 FEET SOUTH AND 1270 FEET WEST; ELK CREEK - 170 FEET NORTH AND 1450 FEET WEST, BOTH FROM E 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 33.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this permit is as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4
SECTION 33
TOWNSHIP 30 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 2, 1993, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1994. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1995.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.
