THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of LOST CREEK RESERVOIR CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-8142, a tributary of ROOGUE RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 1.7 ACRES.

This permit is issued approving Application 72226. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 20, 1992. The use is limited to not more than 7.65 ACRE-FEET STORED WATER ONLY, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

LOST CREEK RESERVOIR - SW 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 26, T 33 S, R 1 E, W.M.

ROGUE RIVER - SW 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 17, T 35 S, R 1 W, W.M.; 1320 FEET NORTH AND 1700 FEET WEST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 17.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of 4.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year stored water only.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this permit is as follows:

NW 1/4 SE 1/4 0.2 ACRE SW 1/4 SE 1/4 1.1 ACRES SE 1/4 SE 1/4 0.4 ACRE

SECTION 17
TOWNSHIP 35 SOUTH, RANGE 1 WEST, W.M.

The water user shall comply with the terms and conditions of contract #0-07-10-W0793 dated April 27, 1992, between Leland F. Thornally and Bureau of Reclamation. A copy of the is in Application File #72226 at the Water Resources Department.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 1, 1993, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1994. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1995.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

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The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.
