to use the waters of AN UNNAMED SPRING, a tributary of AMAZON CREEK, for MAINTENANCE OF A NATURAL POND FOR FISH CULTURE.

This Permit is issued approving Application 69655. The date of priority is JUNE 30, 1988. The use is limited to not more than 0.036 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 16, T 18 S, R 3 W, W.M.; 872 FEET SOUTH AND 738 FEET EAST FROM THE W 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 16.

The permittees shall install, subject to the prior approval and under the general supervision of the watermaster at their own expense, a device at the diversion point capable of measuring and regulating the quantity of flow diverted.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this Permit is as follows:

NW 1/4 SW 1/4
SECTION 16
TOWNSHIP 18 SOUTH, RANGE 3 WEST, W.M.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May $\frac{24}{1}$, 1995 and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1996. Complete application of water shall be made on or before October 1, 1997.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
