PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of ROGUE RIVER AND LOST CREEK RESERVOIR CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-8140, a tributary of PACIFIC OCEAN, for DOMESTIC USE EXPANDED FOR ONE FAMILY AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 0.5 ACRE.

This permit is issued approving Application 71999. The date of priority is NOVEMBER 19, 1991. The use is limited to not more than 0.005 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND for HUMAN CONSUMPTION during the period of June 1 through November 30; 0.01 cfs for DOMESTIC USE EXPANDED during the period December 1 through May 31; and 2.25 acre-foot STORED WATER FROM LOST CREEK RESERVOIR UNDER WATER SERVICE CONTRACT NO. 2-07-10-W0864 during the period of June 1 through October 31 for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

RIVER - NW 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 2, T 36 S, R 7 W, W.M.; 950 FEET SOUTH AND 1500 FEET WEST FROM THE E 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 2.

LOST CREEK RESERVOIR - SW 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 26, T 33 S, R 1 E, W.M.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 5.0 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this permit is as follows:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4 0.5 ACRES SECTION 2 TOWNSHIP 36 SOUTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
- B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director.

In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The use of water under this right is subject to the terms and conditions of contract No. 2-07-10-W0864 or a satisfactory replacement between the Bureau of Reclamation and the applicant, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Department.

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening and by-pass devices as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion. The required screens and by-pass devices are to be in place, functional and approved by an ODFW representative prior to diversion of any water.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 12, 1995 and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1996. Complete application of water shall be made on or before October 1, 1997.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director of the Water Resources Department has found that the proposed use of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.
