PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of AN UNNAMED SPRING, a tributary of ISTHMUS SLOUGH,
for DOMESTIC USE EXPANDED FOR ONE FAMILY.

This permit is issued approving Application 72302. The date of priority
is APRIL 3, 1992. The use is limited to not more than 0.01 CUBIC FOOT
PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point
of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 2, T 27 S, R 13 W, W.M.; 395 FEET SOUTH AND
858 FEET WEST FROM E 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 2.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be
ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this permit is as
follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4
SECTION 2
TOWNSHIP 27 SOUTH, RANGE 13 WEST, W.M.

Measurement recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The Director may require the permittee to install a meter
or other suitable measuring device as approved by the
Director. If the Director notifies the permittee to
install a meter or other measuring device, the permittee
shall install such device within the period stated in the
notice. Such installation period shall not be less than
90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter
installation period. Once installed, the permittee shall
maintain the meter or measuring device in good working
order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter
or measuring device. The Director may provide an
opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative
measuring procedures for review and approval.
- B. The Director may require the permittee to keep and
maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used
and may require the permittee to report water use on a
periodic schedule as established by the Director. In
addition, the Director may require the permittee to
report general water use information, the periods of
water use and the place and nature of use of water under
the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for
the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures
for review and approval.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before JANUARY 13, 1996 and
shall be completed on or before October 1, 1997. Complete application
of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1998.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result
in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil
penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director of the Water Resources Department has found that the proposed use of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.
