The specific limits for the use are listed below along with conditions of use.

APPLICATION FILE NUMBER: S-69973

SOURCE OF WATER: AN UNNAMED STREAM AND MUSTANG RESERVOIR, TO BE CONSTRUCTED UNDER APPLICATION R-69972, PERMIT R-11587, BOTH TRIBUTARIES OF APPELGATE RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 49.8 ACRES AND PRIMARY IRRIGATION OF 0.6 ACRE.

RATE AND VOLUME OF USE: 0.63 CFS AND 1.91 ACRE-FEET

PERIOD OF ALLOWED USE: Water may be appropriated from live flow during the period April 1 through April 30; stored water may be used at any time during the irrigation season of April 1 to November 1 of each year.

DATE OF PRIORITY: June 21, 1989

POINT OF DIVERSION LOCATION: NW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 30, T 37 S, R 5 W, W.M.: STREAM - 1,240 FEET SOUTH AND 2,119 FEET WEST; MUSTANG RESERVOIR - 1188 FEET SOUTH AND 2085 FEET WEST, BOTH FROM NE CORNER, SECTION 30.

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The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
- B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

This right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director finds that the proposed use(s) of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

Actual construction work shall begin within one year from permit issuance and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1997. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1998.
