SOURCE OF WATER: AN UNNAMED STREAM AND THREE UNNAMED RESERVOIRS, CONSTRUCTED UNDER CERTIFICATE 71008, A TRIBUTARY OF NORTH FORK COQUILLE RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 20.0 ACRES, LIVESTOCK, FISH CULTURE, WILDLIFE, AND DOMESTIC USE FOR TWO HOUSEHOLDS

MAXIMUM RATE/VOLUME ALLOWED: 0.015 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS) FROM LIVE FLOW, BEING 0.01 CFS FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION FOR TWO HOUSEHOLDS AND 0.005 CFS FOR LIVESTOCK; AND 1.2 ACRE-FEET PER YEAR FROM LEGALLY STORED WATER FOR IRRIGATION, DOMESTIC USE FOR TWO HOUSEHOLDS, LIVESTOCK, FISH CULTURE, AND WILDLIFE

PERIOD OF USE: YEAR ROUND FROM LEGALLY STORED WATER FOR ALL USES; YEAR ROUND FROM LIVE FLOW FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION AND LIVESTOCK USE ONLY

DATE OF PRIORITY: JANUARY 4, 1995

POINT OF DIVERSION LOCATION: NE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 29, T28S, R12W, W.M.; UNNAMED STREAM - 330 FEET SOUTH AND 810 FEET WEST, RESERVOIR 1 - 330 FEET SOUTH AND 810 FEET WEST, RESERVOIR 2 - 790 FEET SOUTH AND 800 FEET WEST, RESERVOIR 3 - 1060 FEET SOUTH AND 750 FEET WEST, ALL FROM THE NE CORNER SECTION 29

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

THE PLACE OF USE IS LOCATED AS FOLLOWS:

NE 1/4 NE 1/4 20.0 ACRES SECTION 29 TOWNSHIP 28 SOUTH, RANGE 12 WEST, W.M.

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Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The Director may require the permittee to install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. If the Director notifies the permittee to install a meter or other measuring device, the permittee shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period. Once installed, the permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.
- B. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion. The permittee shall also install a fishway at the obstruction that will provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish. The required screens and fishways are to be in place and functional, and the fishway must be approved by Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife before diversion of any water.

The permittee shall not construct, operate or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction to fish passage in the channel of the subject stream unless a fishway is provided as required by ODFW. The required fishway is to be in place and functional prior to diversion of any water.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

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By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director finds that the proposed use(s) of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

Actual construction work shall begin within one year from permit issuance and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1999. The reservoirs shall be filled and complete application of water shall be made on or before October 1, 2000.
