The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

APPLICATION FILE NUMBER: S-81246

SOURCE OF WATER: NORTH SANTIAM RIVER AND DETROIT RESERVOIR, TRIBUTARY OF WILLAMETTE RIVER.

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 24.2 ACRES.

MAXIMUM RATE/VOLUME ALLOWED: 0.30 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND FROM NORTH SANTIAM RIVER AND 36.3 ACRE-FEET STORED WATER FROM DETROIT RESERVOIR.

PERIOD OF USE: NORTH SANTIAM RIVER - MARCH 1 THROUGH JUNE 30 OF EACH YEAR; WATER STORED IN DETROIT RESERVOIR - MARCH 1 THROUGH OCTOBER 31 OR AS FURTHER LIMITED BY THE BUREAU OF RECLAMATION CONTRACT.

DATE OF PRIORITY: JUNE 26, 1996.

POINT OF DIVERSION LOCATION: NE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 22, T9S, R1E, W.M.; 210 FEET SOUTH AND 70 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER, SECTION 22

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of one eightieth of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

THE PLACE OF USE IS LOCATED AS FOLLOWS:

SE 1/4 SE 1/4 16.9 ACRES SECTION 15

NE 1/4 NE 1/4 7.3 ACRES
SECTION 22
TOWNSHIP 9 SOUTH, RANGE 1 EAST, W.M.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.

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- B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening and by-pass devices as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion. The required screens and by-pass devices are to be in place, functional and approved by an ODFW representative prior to diversion of any water.

If the riparian area is disturbed in the process of developing a point of diversion, the permittee shall be responsible for restoration and enhancement of such riparian area to the satisfaction of the Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife.

The use may be restricted if the quality of the source stream, namely the Willamette River, decreases to the point that it no longer meets state and federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.

The use of water under this right is subject to the terms and conditions of contract No.8-07-10-W1210 or a satisfactory replacement, between the Bureau of Reclamation and the applicant, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Department.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

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The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director finds that the proposed use(s) of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

Actual construction work shall begin within one year of permit issuance. Complete application of water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 2002. Within one year after complete application of water to the proposed use, the permittee shall submit a claim of beneficial use, which includes a map and report, prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner (CWRE).
