SOURCE OF WATER: NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, TRIBUTARY TO THE UMPQUA RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE HOUSEHOLD; FURTHER LIMITED TO HUMAN CONSUMPTION USE ONLY DURING THE PERIOD DESCRIBED BELOW

MAXIMUM RATE/VOLUME ALLOWED: 0.005 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

PERIOD OF USE: DOMESTIC: DECEMBER 1 THROUGH JUNE 30; HUMAN CONSUMPTION ONLY: JULY 1 THROUGH NOVEMBER 30

DATE OF PRIORITY: JANUARY 25, 1999

POINT OF DIVERSION LOCATION: SE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 18, T26S, R4W, W.M.; 520 FEET NORTH & 480 FEET WEST FROM E1/4 CORNER, SECTION 18

THE PLACE OF USE IS LOCATED AS FOLLOWS:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4
SECTION 18
TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The Director may require the permittee to install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. If the Director notifies the permittee to install a meter or other measuring device, the permittee shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period. Once installed, the permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the

watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.

- B. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

Low flow shower heads, bathroom and kitchen faucets, and toilets shall be installed in the house prior to use of water, and shall be maintained in good working order.

If the riparian area is disturbed in the process of developing a point of diversion, the permittee shall be responsible for restoration and enhancement of such riparian area.

The use may be restricted if the quality of the source stream or downstream water decrease to the point that those waters no longer meet state or federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.

Prior to use of water, the permittee shall install and maintain an in-line storage tank to provide a water source during critical summer weeks.

The permittee shall restore and enhance the stretch of the riparian area of the seasonal stream running through the permittees property by removing blackberry bushes and by planting native trees and other vegetation.

The permittee shall not construct, operate or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction to fish passage in the channel of the subject stream without providing a fishway to ensure adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish. The applicant is hereby directed to contact an Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Fish Passage Coordinator, Portland, Oregon, before beginning construction of any in-channel obstruction.

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening and by-pass devices as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and

Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion. The required screen is to be in place and functional prior to diversion of any water.

Use of water under the terms of this permit shall not result in overland flow.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.


By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director finds that the proposed use(s) of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

Actual construction work shall begin by February 16, 2001. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 2004. Within one year after complete application of water to the proposed use, the permittee shall submit a claim of beneficial use, which includes a map and report, prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner (CWRE).
