SOURCE OF WATER: WILLAMETTE BASIN PROJECT RESERVOIRS, CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMITS R-1625 AND R-5363, TRIBUTARIES OF MCKENZIE RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION USE ON 0.7 ACRES

MAXIMUM VOLUME: 0.7 ACRE FOOT EACH YEAR

PERIOD OF USE: MARCH 1 THROUGH OCTOBER 31

DATE OF PRIORITY: JULY 31, 2003

POINT OF DIVERSION LOCATIONS:

POD 1: SW  $\frac{1}{4}$  NE  $\frac{1}{4}$ , SECTION 31, T16S, R2E, W.M.; 2170 FEET SOUTH & 1590 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER, SECTION 31

POD 2: SW  $\frac{1}{4}$  NE  $\frac{1}{4}$ , SECTION 31, T16S, R2E, W.M.; 2450 FEET SOUTH & 1530 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER, SECTION 31

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

THE PLACE OF USE IS LOCATED AS FOLLOWS:

SW  $\frac{1}{4}$  NE  $\frac{1}{4}$  0.7 ACRES  
SECTION 31  
TOWNSHIP 16 SOUTH, RANGE 2 EAST, W.M.

## Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
- B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The use of water under this right is subject to the terms and conditions of contracts 059E101503 and 059E101505, or satisfactory replacements, between the Bureau of Reclamation and the applicants, copies of which are on file in the records of the Water Resources Department.

**STANDARD CONDITIONS**

Where two or more water users agree among themselves as to the manner of rotation in the use of water and such agreement is placed in writing and filed by such water users with the watermaster, and such rotation system does not infringe upon such prior rights of any water user not a party to such rotation plan, the watermaster shall distribute the water according to such agreement.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.


By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 2009. If the water is not completely applied before this date, and the permittee wishes to continue development under the permit, the permittee must submit an application for extension of time, which may be approved based upon the merit of the application.

Within one year after complete application of water to the proposed use, the permittee shall submit a claim of beneficial use, which includes a map and report, prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner (CWRE).
