APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, J. W. Allen & Mary E. Allen (Name of Applicant) of Mt. Vernon (Postoffice), County of Grant, State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Spring & Slough (Name of stream)

tributary of John Day River

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 6/80 (.075) cubic feet per second.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Irrigation (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.)

4. The point of diversion is located 550 yds. East of SE corner of NW 1/4 Sec. 28 (Give distance and bearing to section corner) Tp. 13 S R 30 E.W.M. to Slough, and 450 yds. East and 50 yds South to Spring

being within the NW 1/4 of SE 1/4 of Sec. 28, Tp. 13 S (Give smallest legal subdivision) (No. N. or S.)

R. 30 E, W. M., in the county of Grant (No. E. or W.)

5. The Ditch to be 550 yards in length, terminating in the SE 1/4 of NW 1/4 of Sec. 28, Tp. 13 S (Main ditch, canal or pipe line) (Smallest legal subdivision) (No. N. or S.)

R. 30 E, W. M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the accompanying map. (No. E. or W.)

6. The name of the ditch, canal or other works is Allen Ditch

DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

DIVERSION WORKS—

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The right herein granted is limited to the appropriation of water from a spring and slough for irrigation purposes.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 0.075 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is August 1, 1922

Actual construction work shall begin on or before September 8, 1923 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 1, 1924

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1925
