This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

The priority date of this permit is March 20, 1911

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 1/2 (0.50) cubic feet per second.
