do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

EXHIBIT NUMBER 1.

Detailed information as to dimensions of dam, place of headgate, material of which diversion works is to be constructed will depend upon result of engineering work now being initiated. And this applies as well to question number eight, concerning dimensions of canal or pipeline, headgate, grade, etc. As required by the State Engineer, the City will furnish information demanded to fully comply with all legal requirements and demands.

EXHIBIT NUMBER 2.

The waters hereby applied for are all of the waters of Big Butte Creek, a tributary of Rogue River, and of all of the tributaries of said Big Butte Creek, and of all of the streams contributing to said Big Butte Creek, or its tributaries, and of the springs forming said Big Butte Creek and its tributaries. And this application is made subject to such rights as existed on the date at which said Chapter 166 of the General Laws of Oregon for the year 1925 became effective. This is an application for a permit to put to a beneficial use all of the waters granted by said Chapter 166 of said Laws of 1925, and to be allowed to take advantage of and to use all of the rights, benefits and privileges granted to or acquired by the City of Medford by virtue of said Act of said Legislative Assembly. And this application does not waive any of the rights of the said City of Medford, to any of said waters arising under and by virtue of said application number 8092 filed with the State Engineer September 16, 1921, and of Application number 8671 filed with the State Engineer October 2, 1922, nor of any other rights to said waters which it now has from any source, or may in the future acquire.

There is hereto attached, marked Exhibit A to Exhibit Number 2, a copy of a resolution duly passed by the Board of Water Commissioners of the City of Medford on the 6th day of April, 1925, together with a duly certified copy of Ordinance Number 1686 of said City of Medford approved by the Mayor of said City and effective on the date of its approval, April 7, 1925, and marked Exhibit "B" to Exhibit #2. This resolution and ordinance are made in connection with this application, and the same are made parts thereof, and they are likewise authority for the making and filing thereof, and the application is made in accordance with the terms and conditions thereof for permits to be granted accordingly.

RESOLUTION NO. 12.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF WATER COMMISSIONERS of the City of Medford, now duly and regularly convened in session for that purpose, that the City of Medford, Oregon, does hereby accept the provisions of Chapter 166 of the General Laws for Oregon, as the same was enacted by the Legislative Assembly for the Year, 1925, and does hereby accept the rights to the use of the waters of Big Butte Creek, a tributary of the Rogue River, and of the tributaries

of said Big Butte Creek, and of the springs contributing to and forming the same, and does hereby appropriate for municipal purposes of every kind and nature, including domestic, irrigation, sewer, fire protection, and all other municipal uses, all of the waters of said Big Butte Creek, its tributaries, and of said springs, to be diverted in Section 18, Township 35 South of Range 3 east of Willamette Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon, and from the Big Butte Springs situated in the Northwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 21, in said Township and Range.

BE IT RESOLVED FURTHER that the acts of J. M. Keene, as Chairman of the Water Committee, for said City, and of T. W. Miles as a member of said Water Committee, in the making of the application for a permit to appropriate such waters, known as number 8092, and which was filed in the office of the State Engineer of Oregon at Salem, Oregon, on the 16th day of September, 1921, be and the same hereby are ratified and confirmed. And that said City accepts said appropriation so made in its name at said time, and declares it to be the intention of said City to complete the appropriation therein initiated and made, and to utilize the water therein appropriated. And this action of the City in ratifying said acts and taking advantage of said application does not in any way limit or diminish the rights granted to said City by said Chapter 166 of said laws of 1925.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that H. L. Walther, as the Chairman of said Board of Water Commissioners, with M. L. Alford as Secretary of said Commission, take such further and additional instruments as may be necessary or deemed advisable in the completing of said appropriations, in accordance with the priorities acquired under said application number 8092 and number 8671, respectively.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Chairman of said Commission and the said Secretary make, execute and file with the State Engineer of Oregon, in the name of the City of Medford, and by its said officers, an application, in due form as required by law and the rules and regulations of the State Water Board, to appropriate forty cubic feet per second of said waters, to be diverted in said Section 18, Township 35 South of Range 3 East of the Willamette Meridian, and from said springs in said Northwest quarter of said Southwest quarter of said Section 21, for all such purposes of said City, and for domestic, irrigation, sewer and fire protection, and other uses and purposes of said city, and to apply to have the same allotted to said City from such waters withdrawn August 21, 1915, by the State Engineer for Oregon under the provisions of Chapter 87 of the Laws of 1913, and that the priority of the waters so allotted be as of date August 21, 1915, and that said application provide that the said City, in its appropriation and use of said waters so allotted have a priority equal to that of any other claimant to whom an allotment of such withdrawn waters has already been made so far as the use of waters so withdrawn and <sup>so</sup> allotted from such withdrawal are concerned. But this provision as to equal priority of allotted waters out of such withdrawal shall not in any manner interfere with said City's use of water so appropriated, as in this resolution

provided, and as granted by the State of Oregon in said Chapter 166 of said Laws of 1925.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the intention of the city of Medford to so use for its said purpose all of the waters of the said stream, its tributaries and of the s-prings contributing to it and of those forming the same. And that this resolution may be considered an application to said State Engineer for that purpose and to make record of such intention on the part of said city.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT SAID H. L. Walther as Chairman of said Board of water commissioners, and M. L. Alford as its Secretary, file application with the State Engineer of Oregon in the name of and for the benefit of the City of Medford, for a permit to appropriate all of the waters of said Big Butte Creek and of its tributaries and of the springs forming and contributing to it which were open to appropriation on the date at which said Chapter 166 of said laws of 1925 became effective, and to so appropriate for the benefit of said City all of the water of said stream and its said tributaries and springs as of said date, subject<sup>only</sup> to such rights of other users as existed at the date when said Act becomes effective, and execute such instruments and take such action to effect such appropriation as is necessary therefor.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the act of Dr. J. M. Keene as Chairman of the Water Committee for said City of Medford, in the execution and filing of Application 6671 for a permit to appropriate and use fifteen cubic feet per second of the waters of Kings Cabin Springs, a tributary of Big Butte Creek, for municipal purposes for said City of Medford, be and the same hereby is ratified and confirmed as the act of said City, and that the said City hereby declares it to be its intention and purpose to complete said appropriation and to place said water to such beneficial use, and that the making of the other applications herein provided for shall in no wise be a waiver of the rights initiated either by said Application 8092 or said Application 8671. Nor shall the ratification of either of said applications diminish the rights of said City otherwise.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the City Council of the City of Medford for action at its next meeting, and that a copy of such ordinance as shall be passed by said Council in resolution be transmitted to and filed with the said State Engineer, and copies thereof be made exhibits to the application herein provided to be filed with such State Engineer.

## EXHIBIT "B" TO EXHIBIT #2.

ORDINANCE NO. 1686

THE CITY OF MEDFORD DOETH ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the City of Medford, Oregon, does hereby accept the provisions of Chapter 166 of the General Laws for Oregon, as the same was enacted by the Legislative Assembly for the year 1925, and does hereby accept the rights to the use of the waters of Big Butte Creek, a tributary of the Rogue River, and of the tributaries of said Big Butte Creek, and of the springs contributing to and forming the same, and does hereby appropriate for municipal purposes of every kind and nature, including domestic, irrigation, sewer, fire protection, and all other municipal uses, all of the waters of said Big Butte Creek, its tributaries, and of said springs, to be diverted in Section 18, Township 35 South of Range 3 East of the Willamette Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon, and from the Big Butte Springs situated in the Northwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 21, in said Township and Range.

Section 2. That the acts of J. M. Keene, as Chairman of the Water Commission for said City, and of T. W. Miles as a member of said Water Committee, in the making of the application for a permit to appropriate such waters, known as Number 8092, and which was filed in the office of the State Engineer of Oregon at Salem, Oregon, on the 16th day of September, 1921, be and the same hereby are ratified and confirmed. And that said City accepts said appropriation so made in its name at said time, and declares it to be the intention of said City to complete the appropriation therein initiated and made, and to utilize the water therein appropriated. And this action of the City in ratifying said acts and taking advantage of said application does not in any way limit or diminish the rights granted to said City by said Chapter 166 of said Laws of 1925.

Section 3. THAT the act of Dr. J. M. Keene as Chairman of the Water Committee for said City of Medford, in the execution and filing of Application 8671 for a permit to appropriate and use fifteen cubic feet per second of the waters of Kings Cabin Springs, a tributary of Big Butte Creek, for municipal purposes for said City of Medford, be and the same hereby is ratified and confirmed as the act of said City, and that the said City hereby declares it to be its intention and purpose to complete said appropriation and to so place said water to such beneficial use, and that the making of the other applications herein provided for shall in no wise be a waiver of the rights initiated either by said Application 8092 or said Application 8671. Nor shall the ratification of either of said applications diminish the rights of said City otherwise existing and created by said Chapter 166 of said Laws of 1925.

Section 4. THAT H. L. Walther, as the Chairman of said Board of Water Commissioners,

with M. L. Alford as Secretary of said Commission, take such further and additional acts and execute and file with the State Engineer such additional instruments as may be necessary or deemed advisable in the completing of said appropriations, in accordance with the priorities acquired under said applications Number 8092 and Number 8671, respectively.

Section 5. That the said Chariman of said Commission and the said Secretary make, execute and file with the State Engineer of Oregon, in the name of the City of Medford, and by its said officers, an application, in due form as required by law and the rules and regulations of the State Water Board, to appropriate forty cubic feet per second of said waters, to be diverted in said Section 18, Township 35 South of Range 3 East of the Willamette Meridian, and from said springs in said Northwest quarter of said Southwest quarter of said Section 21, for all such municipal purposes of said City, and for domestic, irrigation, sewer and fire protection, and other uses and purposes of said City, and to apply to have the same allotted to said City from such waters withdrawn August 21, 1915, by the State Engineer for Oregon under the provisions of Chapter 87 of the Laws of 1913, and that the priority of the waters so allotted be as of date August 21, 1915. And that said application provide that the said City, in its appropriation and use of said waters so allotted have a priority equal to that of any other claimant to whom an allotment of such withdrawn waters has already been made so far as the use of waters so withdrawn and so allotted from such withdrawal are concerned. But this provision as to equal priority of allotted waters out of such withdrawal shall not in any manner interfere with said City's use of waters so appropriated, as in this ordinance provided, and as granted by the State of Oregon in said Chapter 166 of the said Laws of 1925.

Section 6. THAT such application be so made that if such allotments should fail, or such withdrawal shall be determined to have been ineffectual, that nevertheless such application for such permit to so use said waters shall stand as an application for such permit to use said forty cubic feet per second of said waters by said City for such purposes.

Section 7. THAT it is the intention of the City of Medford to so use for its said purposes all of the waters of the said stream, its tributaries and of the springs contributing to it and of those forming the same. And that this ordinance may be considered an application to said State Engineer for that purpose and to make record of such intention on the part of said City.

Section 8. THAT said H. L. Walther as Chairman of said Board of Water Commissioners and M. L. Alford as its Secretary, file application with the State Engineer of Oregon in the name of and for the benefit of the City of Medford, for a permit to appropriate all of the waters of said Big Butte Creek and of its tributaries and of the springs forming and contributing to it which were open to appropriation on the date at which said Chapter 166 of said Laws of 1925 became effective, and to so appropriate for the benefit of said City all of the waters of said stream and its said tributaries and springs as of said date, subject only to such rights of other users

as existed at the date when said Act became effective, and execute such instruments and take such action to effect such appropriation as is necessary therefor.

Section 9. THAT the action of the Board of Water Commissioners of the City of Medford as set out in its resolution passed on April 6, 1925, and by it transmitted to the City Council of Medford for this action, and which contains substantially the foregoing provisions, be and the same hereby is adopted, ratified and confirmed as the act of the City of Medford.

Section 10. WHEREAS the City of Medford is greatly and immediately in need of a new water supply and of the right to use all the waters referred to and appropriated in this ordinance and it is essential that the provisions of Chapter 166 of the Laws of 1925, as enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon for said year 1925 be immediately accepted by the City of Medford, and the rights therein granted be immediately taken over by said City; and WHEREAS it is necessary that immediate action be taken for the protection of the City's rights under the application which it now has pending and upon which action must be taken; and WHEREAS the City of Medford requires all of the waters of the said Big Butte Creek which may be had and used under the provisions hereof for fire protection, and for domestic use and for sewerage purposes and for irrigation and other municipal uses, and the present water system of said City is inadequate and the pipeline necessary to furnish said water to said City is in need of great repair immediately in order to protect said City. And WHEREAS the Council believes and finds that it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of said City that this ordinance become immediately effective and operative,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that such emergency does exist, and that the peace, health and safety of the City of Medford necessarily requires that this ordinance shall become immediately effective and operative upon its approval by a majority vote of the City Council and the approval of its Mayor, now, Therefore, it is PROVIDED that the foregoing ordinance be upon the receipt of such affirmative vote of a majority of said Council and upon the approval of said Mayor at once operative and effective.

Section 11. That a certified copy of this ordinance be immediately upon such approval and passage transmitted to and filed with the State Engineer of Oregon, and that a copy thereof, together with a copy of said resolution of said Board of Water Commissioners may be affixed to and made a part of the respective applications for appropriation of said Waters as herein provided for.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: ~~for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one eighth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.~~

Subject to existing rights the City of Medford is hereby granted the exclusive right to the use of the waters of Big Butte Creek and of the springs at the head of and which form said stream, and of the tributaries of said stream, for municipal purposes, as provided in Chapter 166, Laws of Oregon for 1925.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed See above. cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of

rotation. The priority date of this permit is May 28, 1925, the date upon which the law providing for this appropriation became effective.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before September 18, 1930 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before September 18, 1930
