To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Oregon State Game Commission, of Portland, Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is An unnamed spring, tributary of Crooked Creek (Agency Lake)

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is Ten cubic feet per second.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is To State Fish Hatchery

4. The point of diversion is located N. 73 00'E. 422 feet distant from the Sec. corner between Secs. 1 and 12.

being within the SW 1/4 of SE 1/4 of Sec. one, Tp. 34 S. of R. 7 1/2 E., W. M., in the county of Klamath

5. The flume to be 979 feet. miles in length, terminating at the S. Bdy. of NE 1/4 of SW 1/4 of Sec. 1, Tp. 34 S. R. 7 1/2 E., W. M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the accompanying map.

6. The name of the ditch, canal or other works is Klamath Hatchery

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The right herein granted is limited to the appropriation of water from an unnamed spring in SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 1, Township 34 South, Range 7 1/2 East, W.M., for fish hatchery purposes.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 10.0 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is July 20, 1925.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 26, 1926 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 1, 1927

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1928.
