APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

CERTIFICATE NO. 8209

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Bessie V. Butler of Service Creek Oregon, County of Wheeler, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is John Day River, tributary of Columbia River

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is One cubic feet per second.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Irrigation

4. The point of diversion is located South 30° West 280 feet from NE corner of SE NW Sec. 10 Tp. 9 S. R. 23 E.

being within the SE NW of Sec. 10, Tp. 9 S, R. 23 E, Wheeler

5. The Ditch to be 3/8 miles in length, terminating in the SW NW of Sec. 10, Tp. 9 S, R. 23 E

6. The name of the ditch, canal or other works is Butler Ditch

DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

DIVERSION WORKS—

7. (a) Height of dam feet, length on top feet, length at bottom feet; material to be used and character of construction

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited

to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The right herein granted is limited to the appropriation of water from the John Day River for irrigation purposes.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 0.09 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is April 14, 1926

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 26, 1927 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 1, 1928

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1929
